A helping of ranch dressing

Views of the Sugarloaf, ample space and a large garden come with this American-style home in Co Wicklow, writes Linda Daly

With its white wooden cladding, blue in the reception rooms. The living room shutters and verandah, Annabasky, in Enniskerry, Co Wicklow, looks like an American ranch house. The fourbedroom, single-storey home, which has views of the Sugarloaf, isn't quite openplan, but it does have 232 sq m of living space and sloping double-height ceilings in a couple of rooms

The front door lies to the right of the house, and the sitting room and kitchen lead off a wide entrance hall with blackand-white tiles. A family room, bathroom and four bedrooms lie off an inner hallway. American walnut flooring has been laid

is double aspect and has a vaulted ceiling. French doors open to the deck and garden. Its feature fireplace with timber mantle, raised hearth and solid-fuel stove resembles those found on ranches.

The kitchen and dining room are open plan and there are two walk-in pantries. Meanwhile, the main bedroom has two walk-in wardrobes and an en suite shower room.

The house has a high-scoring B3 energy rating, and has double-glazing and "high-specification" insulation. There also is underfloor geothermal heating.

A detached annexe comes with an open-plan kitchen and living room with beamed ceiling, plus a double bedroom and shower room.

The half-acre lawned gardens include a large timber deck to the side of the house. Annabasky, on Ballyman Road, is less than five minutes' drive to Enniskerry village and under 10 minutes to Powerscourt.

Gracious living in Ballsbridge

Downsizers and young professionals will find plenty to like about this spacious duplex apartment in Dublin 4, writes Linda Daly

A sale at Shrewsbury Court in Dublin in and car parking. No 4 comes with two July 1975 set a record for apartments in the area. The 112 sq m flat, on the corner of Ailesbury Road and Ailesbury Grove, in Ballsbridge, sold for IR£32,000 (€41,000).

After a 1994 renovation which saw Shrewsbury Court get a new roof, windows and extra apartment, No 4 changed dramatically - it got an extra level. Now it is a 184 sq m, two-storey duplex apartment with three bedrooms.

The development of seven apartments is hidden behind high walls and trees, and surrounded by a mix of landscaping spaces. The apartment, which can be reached by stairs or lift, was bought by its owners about 17 years ago, when they downsized from a large period home.

The lower level includes an open-plan sitting and dining room, with a secret door behind an antique screen leading into a kitchen. A second living room/ study, which has a wall lined with bookshelves, looks out over the communal gardens. There is a bedroom with an en suite shower room at this level, as well as a large guest lavatory/utility room.

A curved staircase, which is fitted with

a stair lift, leads to the two bedrooms on the upper floor. Both bedrooms have en suite shower rooms.

No 4 is on the market as an executor sale. It is the perfect showhouse for downsizers but young professionals on the lookout for a city pad may see it as a place they can modernise.
